Heavy Hauls Over, Offsite “B” Work Completed

The last of 35 barge deliveries of the largest equipment occurred on Oct. 1 and the last of 77 heavy hauls of equipment on Route 2/4 has been completed. The temporary pier has been dismantled and restoration of Offsite Area “B” in Solomons has been completed with the planting of grass seed.

Offsite Area “B” has been restored.

Truck traffic on Cove Point Road continues to support deliveries of steel, piping, prefabricated structures and electrical and mechanical equipment.

Additional, small deliveries come in periodically. We monitor traffic conditions on Cove Point Road and adjust truck delivery schedules to minimize our impact during peak traffic times.

The environmental mitigation for Offsite Area “B” will include restoring a natural oyster bar. The Maryland Department of Natural Resources will conduct a post-construction oyster survey for comparison with surveys done prior to pier installation and during its operation.

The planned mitigation consists of four acres of oyster bar, twice the size of the maximum potential area impacted by the installation and use of the temporary pier.

Dominion has already acquired approximately 15,000 bushels of shell for use as the base and for setting of the oyster spat. The local Calvert County Watermen and Oyster Committee is working with Dominion and the MDNR to complete this phase of the Offsite Area “B” project.

Liquefaction Project Update

The project remains on schedule for completion in late 2017. Engineering and procurement of equipment are essentially complete, and the overall project stands at 75 percent complete.

The project workforce includes more than 550 IHI/Kiewit staff members, more than 1,800 craft employees and 600 subcontractors. About 35 percent of the craft workers are from Southern Maryland.
